## **Anton Chekhov**

An extract from an article by Simon Stephens in the Duke of York's *Vanya* programme.

Chekhov was a man not of the museum but of the theatre. His plays don't need parasols and samovars and reverence (although the parasols might be coming back into fashion in a way he would have enjoyed.) They need a sense of wit and a sense of sex and a sense of a world in which the money is running out and everything seems unstable but in which people are nevertheless capable of doing remarkable and ridiculous things like falling in love and recovering from hangovers.

His plays need to live in this century and this decade. You can tell it by the twinkle in his eye.

Whether or not Chekhov would have enjoyed our approach to his brilliant play can never be known and to speculate about it is a little

silly. Knowing the stories and plays as I do, Chekhov was fond of a touch of silliness but nevertheless it is a futile exercise.

What I do know is that Chekhov loved theatres. He wrote for them, not for libraries. He loved back-stages. He loved audiences and auditoria. He loved the mad collaborations that go into bringing a play to a stage. He loved the gambling spirit of the producer. He loved other writers and encouraged and patronised and scolded them alike. He loved actors. I think he would have loved Andrew Scott because he was palpably a man of taste and intelligence.
